

## INTENT TO ADDRESS THE BOARD

## **WELCOME**:

Pursuant to the Kansas Open Meetings Act (K.S.A. 75-4317, et seq.), the public has the right to attend and observe the meetings of the Board of Education. However, citizens may speak and participate in meetings only to the extent allowed by the Board of Education. Prior to being allowed to address the Board, this form must be completed and given to the Board Clerk no later than 4:30 p.m. on the day of the meeting. Your comments may not exceed three (3) minutes. Patrons may request and be granted an additional minute to complete their comments twice for a total of five minutes. Public comments should be directed toward board policies and administrative procedures and should be respectful. Failure to observe the requirements set out in this form may result in loss of the privilege to address the Board at this and future meetings.

## EXCERPTS FROM BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY NO. 1036

- 1. Patrons may speak to the Board on any item on the agenda of a board meeting or on other items of concern to the school district, provided s/he has completed and signed an "Intent to Address the Board" form specifically identifying the subject matter of the concern and properly filed it with-the Board Clerk.
- 2. Each patron will be limited to one appearance not to exceed three (3) minutes. Patrons may request and be granted an additional minute to complete their comments twice for a total of five minutes. Patrons may not defer their time to another patron. Public communications will be limited to a cumulative total of 30 minutes, unless the time period is extended by the board.
- 3. Allegations or complaints against individual employees or students will not be allowed at an open public meeting and public communications shall be respectful. Complaints about individual employees will be referred to the Superintendent for investigation and resolution.
- 4. Failure to observe the requirements of this policy may result in loss of the privilege to address the Board.
